

RESOLUTION NO. 02

A RESOLUTION OF THE 6th CONGRESS OF THE APSP, FOR THE INTERNATIONAL PEOPLE'S DEMOCRATIC UHURU MOVEMENT TO ORGANIZE AFRICAN FAMILIES OF VICTIMS OF POLICE MURDER.

WHEREAS, statistic reveals that every 26 - 28 hours an African man in the U.S. is killed by the police or regular white vigilantes acting like the police.

WHEREAS, the police departments, courts and legal system label these assassinations as justifiable.

WHEREAS, in the absence of any justice, hundreds of African mothers, wives, sisters, family members and the African community in general, in addition to the burden of having lost our love ones are forced to live with a sense of helplessness.

WHEREAS, And whereas this attack on African people represents a clear example of Genocide by the definition of the U.N. Charter on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide which speaks to, "murdering members of a group."

WHEREAS, the APSP recognizes this question as an important question that must be brought under the leadership of the African revolution so as to mobilize masses of colonize Africans and our allies internationally to implement point #8 of the African People's Socialist Party Platform which calls for the removal of the police from African communities.

SECTION ONE: To this end, I hereby propose that InPDUM, the revolutionary mass organization of the APSP uses its 2014 Convention to organize African families and the African community in general to not only implement point # 8 but also to launch the

international campaign for Reparations to the families of the murdered Africans.

SECTION TWO: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval in the manner provided by the Constitution of the African People's Socialist Party and the Rules of Procedure of this Congress.
