

A RESOLUTION FROM MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL PEOPLE'S DEMOCRATIC UHURU MOVEMENT, WAS DRAFTED NOVEMBER 24, 2013, TO RESTART THE WORK OF INPDUM IN OAKLAND, CALIFORNIA, TO COMBAT THE CONTINUED ANTI-AFRICAN, ANTI-DEMOCRATIC ATTACKS ON THE AFRICAN COMMUNITY BY THE OAKLAND CITY GOVERNMENT.

WHEREAS, for several months, the Oakland Uhuru House has not seen real political activity, to organize the African workers back into revolutionary political life.

WHEREAS, the Oakland city government, in the form of the city council and Mayor, Jean Quan, have escalated the police occupation in the African communities throughout Oakland.

WHEREAS, the city of Oakland has stepped up the gentrification, which continues to displace Africans into areas further away from Oakland.

WHEREAS, the African community has remained defenseless under these and other colonial attacks.

WHEREAS, point number 13 of the African People's Socialist Party states in part, **"We want an end to U.S. colonial domination of African people within the U.S.** We believe that the primary struggle of African people within the U.S. during this period is to throw off the alien U.S. colonial domination which is responsible for virtually every hardship imposed on African people by this government that is identifiable as a "black problem"...

SECTION ONE: The members of InPDUM in Oakland, stand ready to take on these critical political questions of police occupation, gentrification, and the economic stagnation of the African community caused by the colonial domination exercised by the city of Oakland.

SECTION TWO: The members of InPDUM in Oakland have already submitted a plan of action, which focuses on the re-establishment of a Local Executive Committee, Sunday Mass Rallies, political actions that include the reimplementing of the Monthly African Community Conventions to call for the establishment of an African Community Farmer's/Flea Market, to push the question of genuine African economic self reliance.

SECTION THREE: In order to protect the economic and political forward progress in Oakland, we want political guidance from the African People's Socialist Party, on how InPDUM in Oakland can call for the establishment of an African Community City Council.
